INFORMAL GREETINGS



- Hi Maria! **How are things?**
- Oh, hi Sasha! **I'm great. How are you doing?**
- **Not too bad.** It's chilly today, isn't it?
- Yeah, it's really cold.
- Ok, I've got a meeting now. **Gotta dash.**
- **See you later.**



INFORMAL GREETINGS



How are things?
How are you doing?

Great.

I'm good.

I'm OK.

Not too bad.

I've been better.



INFORMAL GREETINGS



It's impolite to say that things are bad.

Incorrect: 'How are you doing?' 'I'm bad'

Correct: 'How are you doing?' 'Not too bad'



Incorrect: 'How are you doing?' 'Nice'

Correct: 'How are you doing?' 'Fine'
or 'Great'.



INFORMAL GREETINGS



What's up? = What's happening in your life

Nothing much.

Nothing

I've bought a new car!

You can say 'goodbye' in many ways:

Bye

See you

See you later

Cheers

Take care

FORMAL GREETINGS



- Good afternoon! My name's Maria.
- Hello, I'm Sasha. Nice to meet you.
- Pleased to meet you too.
- How's everything going?
- Not too bad, thank you. And how are you?
- I'm fine. Maria, can I introduce you to Robert?
- Sure, hello Robert, I'm Maria...



FORMAL GREETINGS



In formal situations (business meetings) phrases like '**what's up**' and '**cheers**' can't be used as they sound very informal.

Instead, use formal phrases:

Good morning/afternoon/evening!

Hello!

How's everything going?

How are you?

Bye.

See you.

See you later.



FORMAL GREETINGS



Can we say 'How do you do?' instead of 'How are you?'

No, we **can't**.

Don't use it because it's old-fashioned unless you meet the Queen for a cup of tea.

Informal:

- Hi!
- How are you doing?
- How are things with you?
- What's up?
- How are you?
- Cheers
- See you
- See you later
- Take care

Formal:

- Hello!
- How are you?
- How's everything going?
- Nice to meet you.
- Pleased to meet you, too.
- Bye
- See you
